

Annual Budget Information

HOPE's annual budget was \$1,688,980. 76% of that amount came from government funding; which includes direct grants from the State of MN, Goodhue County, and The City of Red Wing. 9% is from contributions, those monetary contributions are given with specific intentions for their use. Fundraising monies makes up 5% of our annual budget. Those monies come to HOPE as unrestricted funds, monies that can be used at the discretion of staff.

Volunteers/Donors

The Community Care Fund is a multi-faceted program who serves a great number of individuals every year. 2022-2023 was no different, serving 506 households. Helping an individual/family with basic needs can be the difference between putting food on the table or gas in a car.

Mobile Outreach is our newest endeavor. Advocates set up shop in outlying communities that HOPE serves. This opportunity brings the services offered to people who cannot always come to one of the offices. This program has been able to bring basic needs and referrals outside of Red Wing and Wabasha where our offices are located.

Last year Haven of Hope was able to help 81 individuals with shelter needs. HOH was able to give a safe space to stay totaling 3,989 nights. Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault advocates were able to assist 727 clients with support on their journey to healing. Advocates also answered 593 calls to the 24-hour crisis and support hotline.
